with agency for 17 years



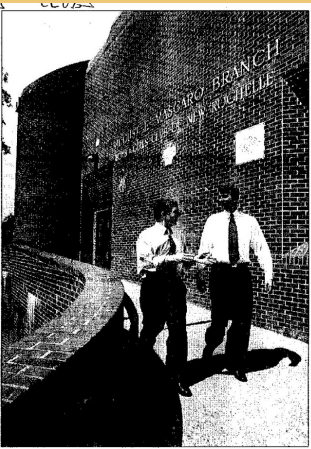

The walls in the office of Richard Marano, executive director of the Boys' & Girls' Clubs of New Rochelle, are filled with adorable photographs of his two small grandchildren, Jamie Moore, 3, and Matthew Moore, 8 months.

Next month, he will leave the connection he has had with the clubs over 17 years; the last 14 as executive director, to participate more fully in their lives in Chippewa Falls, Wis.

There were fewer than 1,000 members and a \$225,000 annual club budget operating in the red when Marano took over in 1984. There are nearly 1,500 members, each paying a \$15 a year membership fee, and a \$400,000 budget operating in the black at present.

Club chooses Templeman as Marano's successor

The Boys' and Girls' Clubs of New Rochelle appointed associate executive director Christian Templeman to succeed Richard Marano, the organization's executive director for the past 15 years. Templeman assumed the position June 11.

A search committee comprised of executive board members, trustees and representatives from all three units unanimously approved the appointment, said President Charles Borrelli. "Chris brings much to the position, not the least of which is six years experience in our organization," Borrelli noted.

Templeman, a Larchmont native who currently lives in Rye, is a graduate of St. Lawrence University. While working as a campaign coordinator for Green Corps, an environmental group in Bellevue, Wash., Templeman got a taste of working with children through a Sierra Club-sponsored environmental education program.

Marano announced last month that he would be moving to Eau Claire, Wisconsin, to be with his family.

Templeman will become the fifth executive director of the agency, which opened in 1929.

In 2001, the Boys & Girls Club opened an extension site at the MacLeay Buildings in City Park known as the RESPECT Extension.

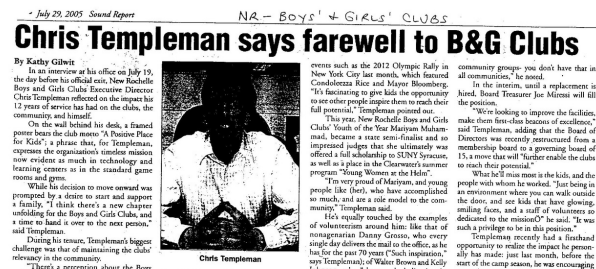
2004
