



Ensuring child safety is fundamental to the mission of Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle

The Safety and Well-being of Young People is Our Number One Priority

We work every day to create a safe, inclusive and fun environment so kids can have every opportunity to be successful in life. We have no tolerance for inappropriate behavior of any kind, including child sexual abuse or misconduct, and we put resources behind this commitment.

Culture of Safety: Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle continually updates robust safety policies, programs, training and supervisory practices for our staff and volunteers that are designed to promote child safety and protect young people from threats that are present in our society. We implement multiple layers of protection to keep our kids safe including:

- Staffing is consistently based on a 1:10 staff-to-member ratio
- Members participate in bi-monthly fire, lockdown and evacuation drills
- Sites are assessed on a bi-annual basis for safety practices, procedures and application of policies

Safety Policies: Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle has comprehensive safety policies in place that protect youth including, but not limited to, supervision, transportation, communication and prohibiting private one-on-one contact.

Mandatory Background Checks: Mandatory criminal background checks for all staff are required upon hire, and at least annually thereafter at Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle. In addition, criminal background checks are required for any volunteer who has direct contact with children. All potential employees and volunteers are also run through the Intellicorp, Inc, background checking system.

Required Immediate Reporting: Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle staff and volunteers are all mandated reporters and are required to report any critical incident/safety concern to local authorities immediately and to the Office of Children & Family Services of New York State. We are also required to report any critical incident to Boys & Girls Clubs of America within 24 hours.

Mandatory Annual Safety Assessments: We complete a safety assessment each year to ensure we continually make improvements to safety at all of our club sites which includes: **NEW ROCHELLE** – Mascaro Clubhouse, Remington Clubhouse, William B Ward Elementary School, George Davis Elementary School, Trinity Elementary School, Columbus Elementary School, Jefferson Elementary School. **LARCHMONT/MAMRONECK** – Mamaroneck Ave. Elementary School, Central Elementary School, Chatsworth Ave. Elementary School, Murray Ave. Elementary School. **OSSINING** - Claremont Elementary School.

Safety Trainings: Ongoing training and supervision of staff and volunteers is critical. Both staff and volunteers participate in a wide variety of child safety training on a continuous basis, such as seminars, conferences, webinars and a semi-annual safety symposium. We also train our staff bi-annually of a variety of safety topics each school year. We also engage leading third-party safety experts to provide guidance for our policies and approaches, including Praesidium, the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, and the National Children’s Advocacy Center.

Safety Committee: Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle has a dedicated safety committee to provide oversight, input and guidance on local policies and safety strategies. Priorities and initiatives include:

- Staff daily safety practices and procedures
- Development of safety trainings and information for staff and members
- Mandating trainings offered through our state licensing organization, Office of Children & Family Services (OCFS)

Mandatory Employee Reference: Any employee interested in moving to another Boys & Girls Club is required to have a reference from the previous Club, even if the Clubs are within the same community.

State and Local Laws: We comply with federal, state and local safety laws, including those impacting facilities and vehicles.

Safety Partnerships: Nationally, Boys & Girls Clubs of America works with leading experts in the areas of safety, security and technology to develop state-of-the-art solutions for Clubs. Partners include:

- National Child Safety Advisory Task Force, made up of leading experts and organizations
- Blue Ribbon Taskforce, comprised of local Club leaders charged with providing input on the safety direction and key safety initiatives
- Mental Health First Aid, a national program that teaches skills to recognize and respond to signs of mental illness and substance abuse
- Crisis Text Line, a confidential text message service for youth in times of crisis

Locally, Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle partners with:

- Office of Children & Family Services (New York State), provides up-to-date information on state regulations and legislation that affects the safety and practices around childcare
- LiveSafe Application, leading mobile platform for safety and security risk reporting, emergency communications, and COVID-19 health assessments and mitigation.

Continued Commitment: In July, 2020, all local Boys & Girls Clubs voted to adopt additional safety measures to further improve safety within our Clubs. Many of these practices were already in place, however, Boys & Girls Clubs determined these practices should be mandatory for all Clubs. These measures include more stringent reference and background checks, enhanced Club Safety Committee requirements for all Clubs, greater communication of key safety resources and information available for staff and members, and more.

Nationally, Boys & Girls Clubs of America has advocated the passage of the **U.S. PROTECT Act**, which improved background screening systems and access. The national organization has also partnered with the **FBI**, the **National Center for Missing & Exploited Children** and the **Centers for Disease Control** to contribute to the development of safety practices that benefit ALL youth-serving organizations.

America's young people deserve nothing less than our constant focus on their safety and our firm commitment to protect every child who is entrusted to our care at Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle.
