## History for the Boys & Girls Club! Remington Clubhouse Hosts Gov. Hochul and Lincoln Neighborhood Investment Announcement



The Remington Clubhouse hosted Gov. Kathy Hochul for an important announcement on Feb. 18 – \$16 million to reconnect the Lincoln Neighborhood, where Remington is a community anchor. The scene represented a beehive of activity, including a throng of elected officials, regional media, the governor's delegation and Club officials, youths and guests enjoying an exciting morning. "We are honored and appreciative that the Remington Clubhouse was specially selected," said CEO

Becky Mazzanobile. "The Club has always served as a gathering place for community dialogue and civic engagement. The Club is committed to supporting initiatives that strengthen New Rochelle and lower Westchester County neighborhoods and expanding opportunities and quality of life for the families we serve."

The [LINC project](#) will transform a portion of Memorial Highway into a pedestrian-friendly corridor with green space, bike lanes and improved crossings. Originally constructed in the 1960s, the highway divided a historically Black



neighborhood from downtown New Rochelle.

Youths from the Remington Clubhouse participated in the LINC project by providing feedback on renderings and sharing their vision for multi-purpose green space, basketball courts, barbecue areas and improved walkability along Lincoln Avenue.

## New Record: Club Serves 12,166 Youths During 2025

The Boys & Girls Club of New Rochelle surpassed a major milestone in 2025. Its comprehensive services and programs benefited 12,166 youths, a record that reflects the Club's role as the largest youth development organization in Westchester County. The total easily surpassed the 10,205 youths served in 2024 – continuing to make our Club one of the fastest-growing Boys & Girls Clubs in the nation.

"This achievement underscores our unwavering commitment to empowering young people, providing safe spaces and creating opportunities for growth and success," said Boys & Girls Club CEO Becky Mazzanobile. "The remarkable increases highlight the impact and vital nature of our programs, as well as the dedication of our Board of Directors, staff, supporters and community. Together we are cultivating brighter futures."

- The Club also saw increases in:
- Registered members: 4,649 in 2025, vs. 3,393 in 2024.
  - Youths served through community outreach: 7,517 in 2025, vs. 6,787 in 2024.
  - Teen members, ages 13 and older: 1,005 in 2025, vs. 813 in 2024.

The Club is proud of its investment in our youths – and looks forward to another record-breaking year in 2026!
