Boys & Girls Club of New Rochelle to Welcome Huguenot Academy Students to Remington Clubhouse

Beginning July 1, 2026, [New Rochelle High School's Huguenot Academy](#) will relocate to the Boys & Girls Club of New Rochelle's [Remington Clubhouse](#), creating a unique educational hub that combines academics, mentorship, career development and [afterschool](#) opportunities under one roof.

The five-year partnership with the City School District of New Rochelle will provide approximately 70 students with access to the Club's state-of-the-art facility, including technology-enabled learning spaces, wellness facilities, and the Mariano Rivera Workforce Learning and Career Center.

"This partnership immerses students into the Remington Clubhouse's dynamic environment, where academic learning, wellness,



mentorship and career development come together under one roof," said Boys & Girls Club of New Rochelle CEO Becky Mazzanobile.

The move also marks the return of a dedicated educational program to New Rochelle's historic Lincoln neighborhood for the first time in more than 60 years. School district leaders noted that the relocation provides students with a

modern, student-centered learning environment while creating seamless access to both Boys & Girls Club and New Rochelle High School [programs](#).

The Boys & Girls Club looks forward to welcoming Huguenot Academy students and staff and continuing its commitment to helping young people achieve academic success and prepare for future careers.
